Technical Tip (2)

If you thought last months hot topic of engine coolant was fascinating, then, lets talk about oil. After all its the lifeblood of any engine. You can survive for a short while without coolant, but lose the oil and you are likely moments away from something quite catastrophic.

I'm not writing to tell you which brand is best. We all have our favourites, but I will say I highly recommend a full mineral 20W50 or 20W60 oil. You will read raging arguments online about zinc levels and other mineral levels — my recommendation is to look for a reputable brand making a classic car specific mineral oil of the right viscosity. Personally, I'm not 'brandist' and I'll use any one of three or four brands but I do have short arms and deep pockets, so if I will one on special at the autoshop that's what I'll buy. And yes, I have been known to mix brands as well so no doubt I've committed a few cardinal sins here in the eyes of some no doubt!!!



Anyway, to my top tips for the month. <u>Always</u> check your oil before you go out. Always! If its down, <u>always</u> top it up to the full line before you go out and track how much and how often you are putting more in. It's a good early indicator of an issue. <u>Always</u> look at the colour of the oil. The colour of the oil, like the cracks in an old house, tell you a story about what is going on inside the engine. Old oil will be black. If its blacker than black, change it. It's done its job and served its time. If it's been in the car for more than 6 months, I'd be thinking about changing it and if it's been in the car for more than 12, change it as mineral oils break down. When its new it will be the colour of Golden Syrup (don't get the two mixed up when cooking tho) and it will slowly darken up, but if it goes black inside only a few drives, it's a good sign that something else is going on deep inside engine. Might be a good time to check that the cooling system is working properly. And if it's starting to turn milky, <u>don't</u> drive it. Milky equals water in the oil so the earlier that you catch it, the cheaper the repair bill is about to be!

One final tip. Don't just think that because you've only done a few hundred miles this year its ok to leave the filter in for a bit longer. Change it at least once every year. It can be a right bugger of a job but its not technically difficult and, like fitting a radiator, it's a great time to get up close and personal with your car.
