Technical Tip (3)

Well, it seems I've been let down by my technical contributor who calls themselves Bernie Hands so I've had to resort to my own back catalogue for this month, so what I was hoping to be a scintillating discussion about what fuel is best for your classic is now an equally riveting discussion about temperature gauges! If you'd like to contribute a 'tech tip', feel free to email me something (and I'll even leave anonymous if that helps!)!

I reckon I read at least one a week a post on Sprite related social media about what temperature a car should be running or where the needle should be pointing at. Seems pretty basic (to me) but the arguments as to what is the correct number it piqued my interest so I wondered if others are equally baffled. The lengths some people will go to arguing what is basically a moot point is astounding.

So here is my basic rule of thumb – ignore the number that the needle is pointing to but do take close note of where it normally points. It's not the number, it's the position and what I look for is when something is not where it should be as that's a sure sign that something has changed.

When I bought my first Sprite (a lovely red Mk3a), I knew nothing about these cars and the previous owner had put a white-out (Tippex/LiquidPaper etc) mark where the needle normally sat. This was a great idea as that particular car had a nasty habit of losing all its water at the most inopportune times and for me, as a complete novice, I knew something was going wrong before it became catastrophic ... and I quickly learned! More recently I had the case with my Midget where the temperature gauge suddenly dropped to zero because the ether tube (the delicate tube



that runs from the front of the block back to the firewall and into the back of the temperature gauge) broke and the temperature gauge failed. Stopped, figure out what had gone wrong and quietly drove straight back home. Now I know that it probably seems obvious to 99% of members in the club but more and more classic cars are being bought by people new to classic motoring that the don't know. Heck, some modern cars don't even have a temperature gauge and you only get a warning if the engine is cold or too hot!

For me it was only a broken gauge which I replaced. Not a hard job but somewhat fiddly as it required getting under the dash. If you find yourself in this position, there are a couple of excellent firms in SA that will repair/replace the broken sensor tube and recalibrate the gauge, or if you are like me and don't like waiting, you can do like I did and head to somewhere like MiniSport and buy a modern recreation and re-fit it.

But, in addition to putting in a new/repaired gauge, I decided to fit a backup system. I found a brilliant little company called Engine Guard (https://engineguard.com.au/) up in North Queensland who supply digital temperature monitoring systems into a variety of vehicles. It's given me two sensor channels, so I now have a digital read out of the temperature from the back of the engine block and also for the oil system. Its really simply to install (took me about 30 minutes), draws little power so it wont mess with the Lucas Electrics and it can be installed just about anywhere, either on the dash or discretely hidden away. If you want it completely hidden, it also has an audible alarm system.

And best of all – its proudly 100% Australian designed and manufactured (not imported), so it's supporting local families and I like that! I'm happy to show the system to anyone interested or put you in contact with the company if you can't find them. I found them via Google and it didn't cost the earth.
