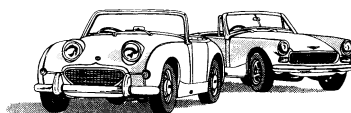

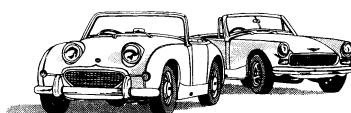

Technical Tip (#13)



Ever wondered why its so important to put the correct oil into our aging cars? The March Tech Tip comes to you from Michael at Lawless Classic Oils (see next page). I don't think it matters if you are using Castrol Classic (as I do), Penrite or another brand, getting the formation correct is the most important thing.

WHY USE CLASSIC OILS ?

The formulations required for modern vehicles are very different from those needed for older vehicles. 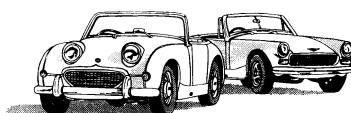

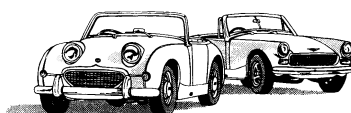

LE MANS SPRITES

Works prototype could be forerunner of a new production GT coupe, reports GORDON WILKINS. Le Mans version has low weight, 75 bhp.

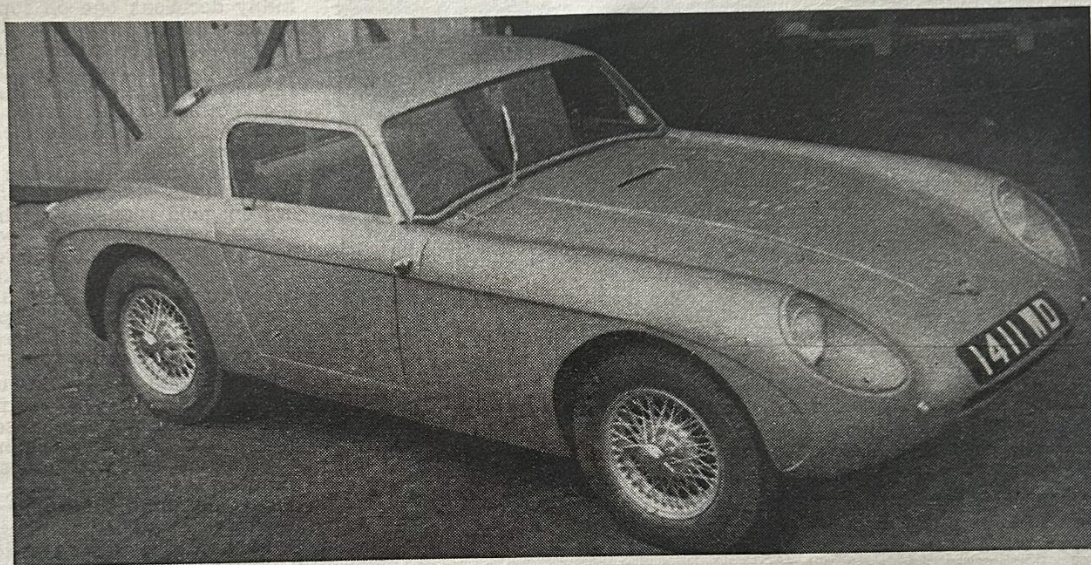
THIS special Austin Healey Sprite coupe was built by Donald Healey Motors at Warwick for the Le Mans 24 Hour race.

Coachwork is in light alloy on a standard Mark II base structure and the car weighs only 1175 lb. Cylinder bores have been increased by .20" to raise the capacity to 994 cc and with a compression ratio of 10.5 to 1 the engine is capable of delivering about 75 bhp.

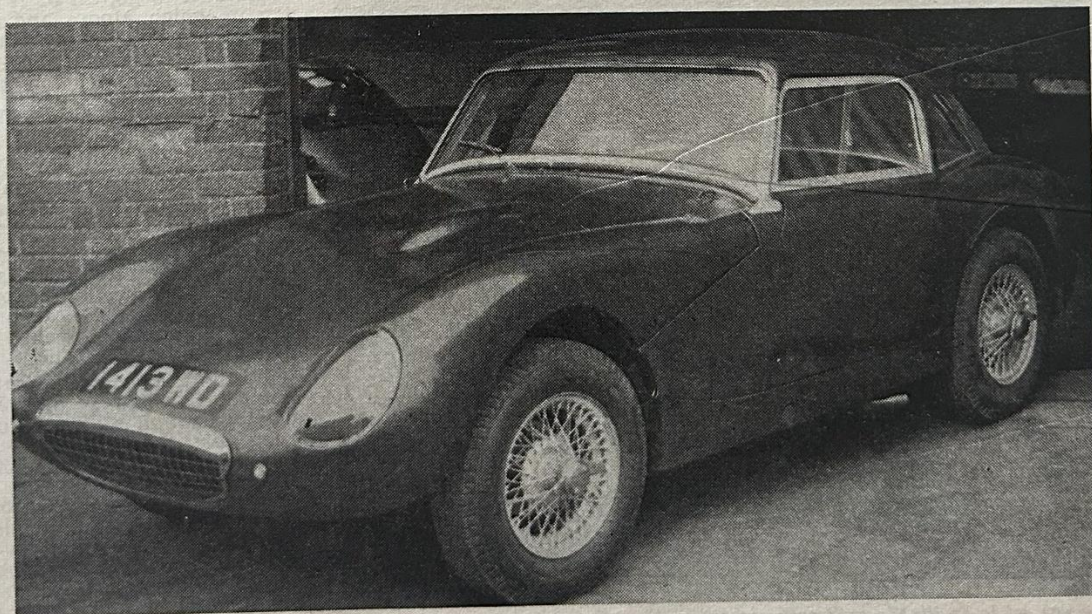
Tyres are 5.25-13 and the reduction in weight and wind resistance has allowed a high axle of

3.9 to 1 to be installed. Even so the engine should pull 6500 rpm on top and maximum speed is calculated as 117 mph.

Immediate objective is a good performance on performance index and thermal efficiency index as the low drag and high gearing should give a very low fuel consumption at high cruising speeds. If the prototype proves satisfactory a batch may be put in hand for production. Panels would then be produced from press tools and winding glass instead of plastic windows would be fitted. #

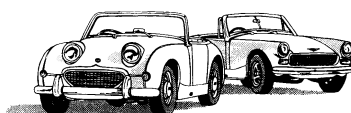


Works car shows great sales potential. Note single wiper, wire wheels and petrol filler cap recessed into the fixed hardtop.

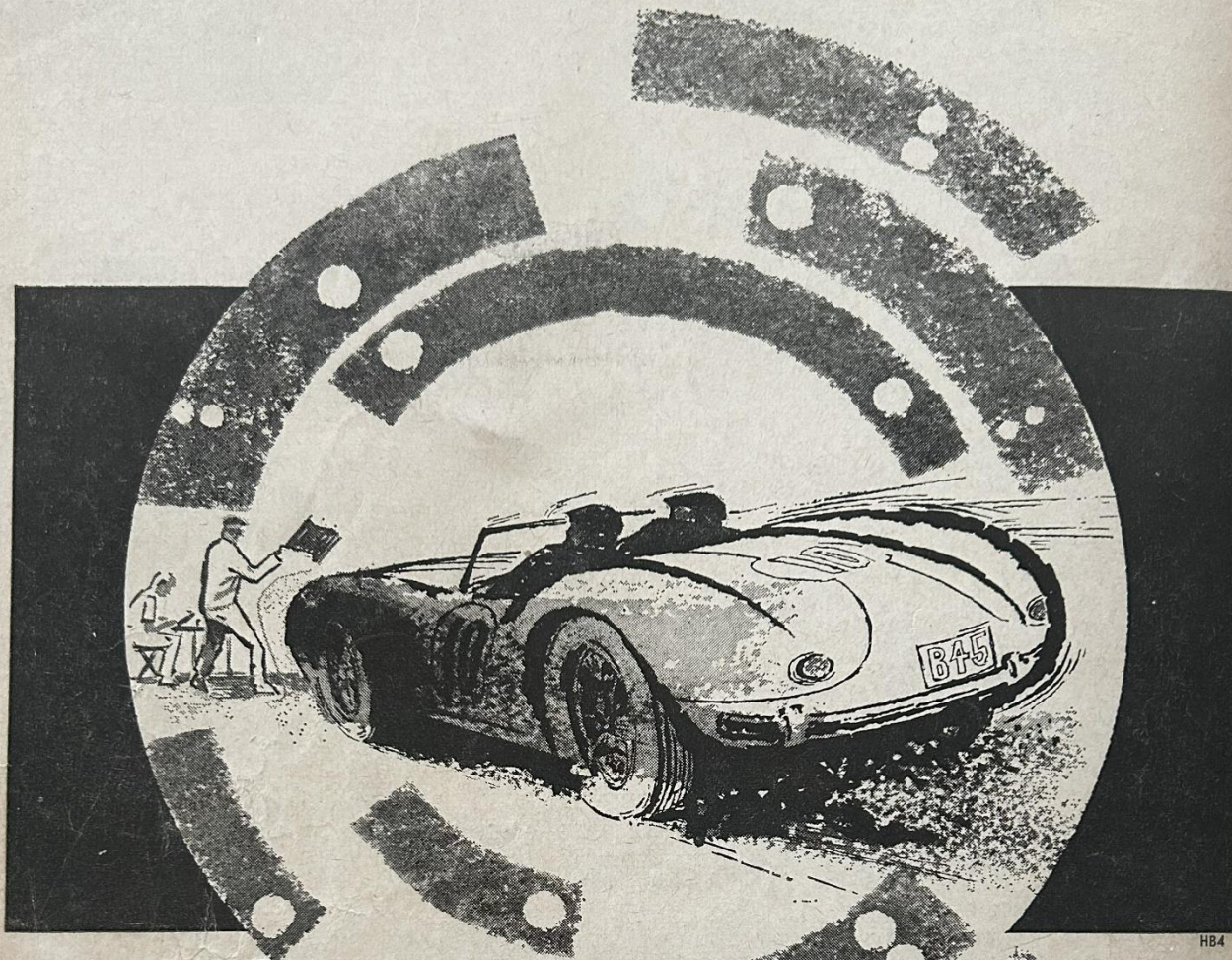


Another Le Mans coupe built for Ecurie Ecosse shows a different line of thought. General lines aren't as pretty as works car.
