For the Sprite Club of South Australia's October General Meeting we had a change of meeting rooms.

Member Gary Dodd had arranged with Manger, Andy Morgan to visit and tour Richmond's – Prestige & Classic Cars Showroom on Richmond Road, Richmond.

Nearly 50 members (50!!) gathered for an intro to Andy who outlined the history of the company that has been in business for eight years. The facility covers the vehicle showroom, the workshop and the car storage facility.

Andy also has his new vehicle on display, 1964 Austin Cooper S. This Red and Black Roof vehicle showed the classic style of the early Mini Coopers, and Andy's is a perfect example of these fun vehicles. Andy has had a BMC interest, previously owning a Pale Primrose MGC (which was in the showroom) and a MG Midget Mk I.

Members were given the opportunity to view the cars in the showroom. These vehicles are on consignment, so the owners have the opportunity to sell their vehicles through this showroom, and the online site.

While there were no Sprites or Midgets for sale, there were MG, Triumph, Jaguar and Austin Healey examples for sale, so the Union Jack was supported. Surrounding these vehicles were Ferrari, Porsche, Mercedes Benz, Dodge, Opel plus a range of European and American vehicles for sale. Oh, and a 1978 Aston Martin V8 'Oscar India' that the President is still waiting to be delviered to his house.... hmm. Somehow I don't think so!

CLIMB TO THE EAGLE

An Adelaide Grand Prix tradition continues

Whilst the Adelaide GP is many years long gone, one tradition remains, the 'Climb to the Eagle', this year brought forward a week due to the setting up for the Adelaide 500.

The event harks back to the Friday of the very first GP. The 'Readers Digest' version of events is the group tasked with staging the support acts for the GP. With the historic race cars for one of the events stabled about 500 meters from the track and needing to drive on public roads they needed a three day temporary rego.

So, what do you do with millions of dollars of priceless racing cars now effectively registered for South Australian roads? You run them up the highway, through Devils Elbow and up to the Eagle on the Hill of course and nearly 40 years later, the tradition continues!

Cars from the Sprite Club have participated on the run since the first one was opened up to the public (and possibly before) and this year was no different with about 10 members taking part!





CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION

IMPORTANT NOTICE - PLEASE READ!

Many of us enjoy the advantages offered by the South Australian Government Conditional Registration scheme, be it for our historic car or individually constructed vehicle.

The conditional registration is tied directly to your membership. As a reminder, the membership year is 1 January to 31 December each year.

If you are **NOT** a financial member on 1 January 2025, you **CAN'T** drive your conditionally registered car on a New Year's Day run.

The Registrar needs to sight proof of your financial membership status before they can sign your logbook for 2025. If the logbook has **NOT** been signed for 2025, you **CAN'T** drive your classic.

Please, make no mistake. If you are not a financial member for 2025 and (or) you have have not had an authorised Officer from the Club sight and sign your logbook, you cannot drive your Conditionally registered vehicle.

We were chasing a large number of people well into 2024. The Club must notify ServicesSA within 90 days of the new Club FY of non-financial members and those registrations are then cancelled. Not by us, but by Services SA. You are then required to restart the whole registration process so its best to just get it sorted as quickly as possible! Its a huge fine if you are caught. Well in excess of \$1000.

Memberships will be available for renewal AFTER the Annual General Meeting. We will be calling for a vote on a small increase in the membership fee (from \$50 to \$60 a year). Once the 2025 fees has been set you can pay your fees in cash, by cheque or electronic funds transfer.

Log books can be signed once you've paid at the December meeting, by appointment with Don or Gordon, or you can mail them in (with a stamped self-addressed envelope).

The club may hold a log-book night in late November or early December if there's enough demand.


